All – FOR INFORMATION – COVID UPDATE including end of free LFT

Following the latest guidance from the government, we can confirm the following Covid 19 procedure from 1st April:

- Unfortunately, we can longer provide free lateral flow tests and students/parents will need to purchase these separately if required.
- Students who decide to test and are asymptomatic are asked to stay at home for 3 days after the day of the test.
- The NHS has updated the list of symptoms for COVID-19. On Thursday 24th March six brave Year 13 students sat the English Speaking Board Grade 6 Certificate in Speech.
