The link to apply for bursary funding will be sent out during half-term to all EMS students. Apologies that this has been delayed and thank you for your patience. We're using a new system and welcome any feedback from you on how you find the process. Applications have to be made by the student, rather than a parent or guardian, using their School email. This bursary covers the cost of travel passes, graphical calculators and other educational resources.

The bursary funding is for students from households where the gross income is £26,000 or under. EMS is given a limited amount of money for bursaries each year and therefore the criteria has to be restricted as well, so that funds go to those facing the most financial hardship.
