We will be taking all of Year 12 to the UCAS Discovery Event at Westpoint on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March during lessons 2 & 3. Students have received all the information for this event in the UCAS channel in Teams. UCAS is the University and College Admissions Service, and students apply to universities through UCAS. This exhibition is a chance to meet representatives from most of the universities across the country, to pick up prospectuses and to ask questions.

In assembly two weeks ago, Year 12 had a visiting speaker from the University of Exeter talking about choosing universities and courses, and this week they had a speaker talking about higher and degree level apprenticeships. During tutorials this term students are starting research into universities and courses. The UCAS application window starts mid-May.

After Easter we will officially launch the UCAS process with an assembly to students and an online Parents Information Evening on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> May between 1700 and 1800. 

## ALL - EMS NEWS - EMC Conference




It was excellent to have such a wonderful atmosphere akin to an academic conference, which we hope many of our students will frequent later in life. Well done to everyone - great job!
