As the A-level examinations are approaching the end we want to take this opportunity to inform parents that we will be processing any special consideration paperwork at the start of next week (w/b 24/06/24) and we will inform affected students once submitted.

For your information:

Candidates will be eligible for special consideration if they have been fully prepared and have covered the whole course but performance in the examination is materially affected by adverse circumstances beyond their control. This may include: temporary illness or accident/injury at the time of the assessment, bereavement at the time of the assessment, domestic crisis at the time of the assessment.

The centre must be satisfied that there has been a material detrimental effect on candidate examination performance and appropriate and up to date evidence must support the application for special consideration. A decision will then be made by the awarding body will be based on various factors.

We are sharing this information with you in case there are exceptional circumstances that have negatively impacted your child but that you have not informed us of. #### Year 12 - FOR INFORMATION - Year 12 Assessments and Feedback

Year 12 assessments started on Wednesday this week and will continue for the whole of next week. There are no EMS lessons for the duration of the assessments.

Between **Monday 1st and Wednesday 3rd July** students will have a bespoke timetable, with sessions on personal statement writing, UCAS admin, EMC projects and the launch of the NEA (coursework) for students studying Computer Science. Some students will also be supporting our "New Student Information Day" on **Tuesday 2nd July**. On the afternoon of **Wednesday 3rd of July** students will be going to the beach – information is provided in this update.

There is a non-student day on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> July, during which teachers will be deciding students' UCAS predicted grades. Feedback lessons, to review the recent assessments, will run on Thursday 4th July, Monday 8th July and the morning of Tuesday 9th July. Students will be asked to book a 30 minute review meeting with their tutor, which parents are welcome to attend, for either Tuesday 9th July (1400-2000) or Wednesday 10th July (0900-1200). This can be in person or remote via Teams or students can attend in person with parents logging in remotely. In this meeting students will receive their assessment results and their UCAS predictions.

Wednesday 10th July is the last day of term for students. After the review meetings we will then have an end of year assembly followed by a barbecue in the courtyard.

Students have received a timetable and more detailed information via a post in Teams.

### Year 12 - FOR INFORMATION - University Admissions Tests

We will shortly be sending parents and students a factsheet about details of University Admissions Tests, detailing what they are, changes for 2024-5, and how students should be preparing.

These tests, such as MAT, TMUA and STEP are taken in addition to A levels and form part of the application process for some competitive universities. It is likely that TMUA in particular will be used by a wider group of Universities this year than in the past.

Students intending to take MAT, PAT or TMUA should pay particular attention to registration dates: for the first time this year, these tests will be at external test centres, requiring students to register and book these assessments themselves. It is recommended they do this as early as possible whilst places in convenient test centres are available. Standard Exam Access arrangements should be available to students, but these students will need to ensure they request these themselves.

## Year 12 – FOR INFORMATION – Social Day and Trip to the Beach

On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July, Year 12 students will be going on our annual trip to Exmouth Beach, aimed at promoting independence in travel. In previous years, students have used various modes of transportation to reach the beach, such as trains, buses, cycling, or running.

Students will leave school at 11:30am and each group must have at least three students for safety. Students need to inform Yasmin of their travel plans both to and from the beach. While at the beach, students will not be allowed to swim or engage in any other water sports. Instead, they can participate in a range of activities such as Blingoball, Pétanque, a reading group, sandcastle competitions, and crafting. We will stay at the beach until 3:15 pm, when students will make their own way home/to boarding. Some students may wish to remain at Exmouth beach.

All students will be supervised by staff at the beach from 12.30pm to 3.15pm. Students will need to bring a packed lunch or some money for food, we will provide the picnic blankets!

#### All – EMS News – Year 12 Trip to Royal Albert Memorial Museum




We took all of Year 12 to the Royal Albert Memorial Museum last week for our last Pastoral session of the year.



## All – EMS News – Yuila's Dream – Presentation by Maksym

On the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 2024 the second annual Yuila's Dream Conference was hosted by MIT. **Yulia's Dream** is a free Maths enrichment and research program for exceptional high school students from Ukraine. Under this program, students meet online once a week in small groups to study advanced Maths topics beyond high school curriculum or work on Maths research projects under the guidance of academic mentors. This conference is dedicated to the memory of **Yulia Zdanovska**, a 21-year-old graduate of the National University of Kyiv, a silver



medallist at the 2017 European Girls' Mathematical Olympiad, and a teacher for the "Teach for Ukraine" program who was killed by a Russian-fired missile in her home city of Kharkiv.



Ukrainian EMS student, Maksym, in Year 13 did a fantastic presentation to the conference on colour plane groups – a project he did in collaboration with two other Ukrainian students. The conference was a huge success and we would like to congratulate Maksym for his involvement and brilliant talk - well done Maksym!
