Year 13 - FOR INFORMATION - Computer Science Non-Exam-Based Assessment

We recognise the challenge in balancing the need to rest and the ambition to continue with work, with the aim to achieve the best possible outcomes. With the aim to assist students in finding this balance, Will has made sure that each student has a written comment relating to their project. These comments are limited by the strict regulations for Non-Exam-Based Assessments. As such, we are unable to state specific changes or additions to the work for which marks can be awarded. We can highlight areas of the markscheme which the student should focus on and ask questions about the way a student is approaching their project. The latter has been achieved in lessons and weekly drop-in sessions, to which some students have been invited throughout the year. Please note that, as any other form of assessment, the NEA needs to be authenticated as the students own and any additional assistance will have to be declared and may mean a reduction in marks awarded. Forms of additional assistance include, but are not restricted to websites, individuals with expertise and generative AI.
















ALL – EMS NEWS – Message from the Boarding Team

ALL - EMS NEWS - EMC Christmas Lectures




