## All - FOR INFORMATION - EMS Alumni - Paid Teacher Internship

There are still places available on the Paid Teacher Internship programme running from the 23<sup>rd</sup> June to 11<sup>th</sup> July 2025. The programme is managed by Exeter Maths School in partnership with the South West Institute for Teaching/Blackdown Education Partnership and South West Teacher Training and is open to students currently studying at university (including master's students) who are considering a career teaching Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, Modern Foreign Languages or Physics.

Interns receive £1,275 for full attendance on the three week programme (pay is deducted for absences) and have the opportunity to spend time in a secondary school in Devon, Plymouth, Somerset or Torbay.
