Results are now in for the Maths Olympiad for Girls and the Senior Maths Challenge.

All four of the entries for the Maths Olympiad for Girls achieved a Distinction, which is a fantastic result, with one student qualifying for the very prestigious follow-on competition, the British Maths Olympiad.

We had a whopping 113 students enter the Senior Math Challenge and the results were superb with 95% of entries obtaining a Gold, Silver or Bronze, including 44 Golds one student obtaining a perfect score! Four students have qualified for the British Mathematics Olympiad and 40 students have qualified for the Senior Kangaroo both taking place on **Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> November**.

Congratulations to everyone who participated, and we look forward to the next round of competitions!
